Tales of old

Meet George Hellier III. He bought our Prebend – the house (now Whitchurch Farm, near Ston Easton) with Whitchurch and Binegar manors. The Civil War had barely started when Parliament abolished bishops, seized their lands and started selling off Church assets.

George Hellier must have bought Whitchurch in 1647. We know this because Sir Edward and Dame Mary Alford sued Hellier in the Court of Chancery in 1648. Alford's *Bill of Complaint* and Hellier's *Answer* survive in the National Archive. They are hand written on vellum – calfskin – each with more than 100 lines, each line with 60-70 words.

The writing is beautiful but tiny. It is also mainly illegible though you can pick out some complaints: taking into the Hellier estate land belonging to others, demanding rent from land Hellier did not own, diverting roads to prevent others using them, closing a ford across Wellow Brook, evictions, boundary disputes and more. It resembles a landed gent's objection to 'new money' elbowing the old order aside.

George Hellier's Answer was as long and detailed with lists of payments made for this piece of land and that. He even lists the thousands of pounds he paid the Alford's agent. History does not record the Court's verdict but the Helliers prospered at Whitchurch.

Sir Edward Alford was an MP and a big landowner including Stanton Drew Manor. He fought on the King's side in the Civil War but was caught in the surrender of Exeter in 1649. For this "delinquency", Parliament punished him severely with a fine of £5,389 (£550,000 today). It looks like George Hellier had the last laugh.

History remembers George's grandfather George (I) as a clothier in Wickwar, Gloucestershire. George's father George (II) traded in iron. He was Sheriff of Bristol in 1638 and Mayor in 1653. He was a ruthless merchant with dozens of law suits. He married well. Wife Sarah was the daughter of Humphrey Hooke, lord of the manors of Midsomer Norton and King Weston. For his son's generation, however, the relationship between the families would become very sour.

George's son, George (III) is the one who bought our Prebend when he was around age 30. It must have been a Christmas to celebrate that year. George, I am sure, wishes you a Happy Christmas this year.

Grenville's Ramblin's...

The unusual and beautifully clear view of Binegar church, especially of the tower, in the October magazine, brought to mind many fond memories of what was nigh on a lifetime of my involvement with the church. It all began in 1932 when I, like my mother before me, her father and her grandfather (who was for many years sexton and parish clerk) were, as was the custom in those days, Baptised at the ancient Font just inside the church door. However my regular attendance began when I was about 10 years old and had been encouraged to join the choir; I was always there early for 6.30 Evensong and it being before the days of electricity in the village, I helped the churchwarden (Frank Lambert, in whose footsteps I was to follow many years later) to light the big brass oil lamps hanging on counter balanced chains from the roof timbers. My next step was to be invited to learn to ring a bell and join the team of bell ringers; so began my long involvement with the church affairs and in some ways especially with the tower.

When I'd got to the age of 14, I went to work for Ernest Colbourn, the village carpenter, wheelwright and undertaker and having by that time become involved in caring for the bells, I began making and replacing broken bell stays etc.

What could I suppose be called my next step up the ladder, came with the retirement and moving away of churchwarden Frank Lambert, when at the age of 24 it was decided by the PCC that I should take his place. So, it is looking down on the photo of the tower roof and the flagpole reminded me of the countless times that I, having in those early days being able to run up the ninety steps, had stood there for one reason or another!

It also reminds me of an occasion concerning the flagpole, when I was stood up there talking to steeple jack David Dawson about how quickly the wooden poles got rotten, when he said we've got some 4-inch alloy tube back in the yard; we could make you up a pole that won't rot. Well, to cut a long story short, the new pole being duly delivered, all that was left to do was to get it to the top of the tower and fixed into place. Of course, a twenty odd foot pole isn't the sort of thing that will go up tower stairs. So, one Saturday morning with the aid of rope and pulley and fellow church members Peter Manders and John Salvidge the pole was hoisted up the outside of the tower and fixed in place.

So it was, it became my delight to fly the flag for church festivals and other special occasions, as long as the wind was not blowing a gale, because a flag measuring some three yards by one and a half will quickly fray all to pieces. But most of all I remember the Christmas mornings when the flag was flying in time for the 8am communion service.

The December Garden

FAST MENDIP GARDENING CLUB - JANE EVANS

Don't think because December is on us there is nothing to do in the garden! With limited daylight hours as we approach the shortest day of the year, this month's crisp, wintery weather can be strikingly beautiful and bitterly cold in equal measure.

Group potted plants together in a sheltered spot to protect them from the harshest weather.



Wisteria, fruit trees, roses and Japanese maples are just some of the plants to benefit from a winter prune.

Look after the birds - clean feeders. stock up on fat balls and make sure they have access to fresh water.

Plant deciduous, climbing honeysuckle now, but make sure to avoid any frozen or waterlogged ground.

If any of your roses suffered from blackspot or rust this summer, gather up and remove any fallen leaves to reduce the chance of infection next year.



Take root cuttings of oriental poppies and grow them on in cold frames.

Spread fresh gravel or grit around alpine plants.

Remove yellowing leaves from your brassicas they may harbour pests and diseases.

Dig a trench for next year's beans, fill with compostable kitchen waste (not cooked food) and recover with soil. This will rot down and dramatically improve sowing conditions.



Keep fleece to hand to protect hardy salad crops.

Cover heavy clay soils with polythene to keep it drier and allow winter digging.

Lift and divide established clumps of rhubarb to renew the planet's vigour. Sections taken from the outside of the plants are better than those from the centre.



Protect wall trained peaches and nectarines from wet winter weather which spreads the peach leaf fungus. Construct a screen of clear polythene over the plant but not touching it.

Protect the tips of fig tree branches, cover with fleece or straw. They will carry the fruits for next year and are susceptible to frost.

Wash and disinfect capillary matting before storing it away.

Protect your poinsettias from cold draughts and allow to dry out slightly between waterings to make them last for the whole Christmas period and well into January.

Avoid walking on your lawn when it's blanketed by heavy frost or snow, as this damages the grass.

Send your lawnmower and shears to be serviced and sharpened.

Wash down your garden tools and give them a wipe of linseed oil on the wooden and metal area to help prevent rusting.

Choose a dry day to clear out the garden shed in preparation for the spring.

Check the security of your shed. This is particularly important in winter when you visit it less often.

Repair fences and apply a wood preservative to prevent them from rotting.

Plant bare root edible hedging now while the plant is dormant, for a homegrown foraging experience in your garden.

Did you know the colourful wrappers of Quality Street sweets are compostable? They're made from cellulose, derived from wood pulp, so add them to your compost heap.

Oakhill & Ashwick Local History Group

The House before Pondsmead – a Detective Story – Lin Thorley

Working on local history can sometimes feel like being a detective! Researching the house that preceded the present day Pondsmead is a good example. I had a theory about the name of this house, which took a while to prove.

A trawl through the records yielded the following: Frederick Spencer, co-owner of the Brewery, built Pondsmead in 1875. The name Pondsmead does not appear anywhere until 1877. It was said there was a previous house on the same site, but the only evidence was one photograph, shown below. But as the name is not used until 1877, did the earlier one have another name? There have been several (polite) arguments within the History Group as to whether this earlier house was actually called Pondsmead, and if not, then what was it called – and did the house shown even stand on that site, or somewhere else... I needed to widen the search.

Going back to the owners/occupiers of the site, first it was James Jordan, one of the cofounders of the Brewery in 1767. Where did he live? We know he occupied the site as part of the Brewery land until he retired in 1803. He was replaced by William Peard Jillard. The Jillard family are known to have lived at Oakhill Cottage, which is on Zion Hill. But see below. The Jillard Estate map of 1822 shows a house

almost on the site of the current Pondsmead, but facing east towards the Bath Rd, so at right angles to it. Was this Pondsmead's predecessor? If so, what was it called?

I found hints in the records of the name 'Cottage' belonging to that site – somewhat unexpectedly for such a large house (although the word cottage does not always mean small, often simply quaint or rustic – as in some of the Royal Family's residences). The 1830 Turnpike Map names the village, 'Oakhill',

and just below that word is an intriguing but inconclusive: 'Cottage'. Putting the two words together, could 'Oakhill Cottage' be the name of Pondsmead's predecessor?

If so, what about Oakhill Cottage on Zion Hill? Surprisingly, the Zion Hill house is not named on any record that I can find – map, document or census - before the 1920's, when John and Elsie Hilliar moved in. One of the Oakhill books records the history of the house, stating that the lillard family lived there during the 1800's. Details are given of a fire at its lodge in 1860, property of Captain Jillard (this was William Vernon lillard, son of the co-owner referred to above, and also a partner in the Brewery). Also mentioned is that WV Jillard died there in 1871; it was then renovated by another William Peard Jillard in 1872 (WV's only son). The amount of detail made the story seem authentic. Yet some things did not add up. There is, for example, no space for a lodge on Zion Hill (the Old Church Rooms are known to have been its stables). And the Rev John Davis owned the house in 1842; his brother Henry lived in it. So how could the Jillards have also lived there? Initially I took the account as fact, but eventually became suspicious that the information had been gleaned from published


reports on Oakhill Cottage and applied to the house on Zion Hill – and checking the newspaper reports of the time this is exactly the information that can be found about Oakhill Cottage in Oakhill (no further location mentioned). Given that the new house next to the Brewery had been named Pondsmead in the 1870's, maybe the Hilliar family adopted the name Oakhill Cottage when they moved into the Zion Hill house in the 1920's? There was a Brewery connection: John Hilliar (known as Jack) worked for the Brewery as its Traveller (salesman).

Then I found an article on the early Brewery saying that "Oakhill Cottage was demolished in 1872 as not grand enough..." Aha. Obviously

not the one on Zion Hill which still stands. The clinching evidence came from censuses. Initial checks had yielded nothing helpful. Frustrated, I went back to the beginning again. There, lo and behold, was the answer. Instead of finding the lillards where I had expected them to be, in Ashwick Parish (on Zion Hill), there they were in Shepton (the southern part of Oakhill was in Shepton parish until boundary changes later in the century). The 1861 census even gave the name Oakhill Cottage to their house! And it was on the Bath Rd, exactly where Pondsmead is now... Mystery solved. But I am astonished that such an important village fact had been totally forgotten in so short a time.

Planning

2021/2398/LBC - Erection of first floor extension - Oakhill Cottage, Zion Hill, Oakhill Council recommended that this planning application should be passed to the Listed Building team at Mendip.

2021/2397/FUL - Erection of first floor extension - Oakhill Cottage, Zion Hill, Oakhill Council recommended approval of this application.

Highways

The Council continues to lobby for the 30mph speed along Galley Batch to be extended beyond Greenlands Farm. This had previously been agreed but not actioned by County Highways.

Opening-up Safely and Reconnecting Communities Fund

The Parish Council submitted a grant application on behalf of the Village Hall. The application was successful with an award of £5000 - Congratulations!
