Volunteer to be an Independent Visitor or Advocate for children in Somerset.

These are fascinating and inspiring opportunities, which can bring real benefits to vulnerable children and young people. (Travel and reasonable expenses are reimbursed.)

You can help children and young people understand their rights and ensure that their views, wishes and feelings are heard.

What is an Independent Visitor?

Independent Visitors are volunteers who befriend and spend time with a child or young person who is in the care of the Local Authority. By law all local authorities have to provide an Independent Visitor service.

In Somerset our intention is to encourage the relationship between the Independent Visitor and young person to continue beyond care. This way the care leavers continue to benefit from support, while making the transition to young adulthood. Independent Visitors are highly valued by the young people as they may be the only person involved in their lives who is not paid to be there.



What is an Advocate?

An Advocate is an independent person who can offer one-to-one support to children and young people to have their voice heard when meetings are taking place concerning their wellbeing. It's the role of the Advocate to speak up for the young person, make them aware of their rights, listen to them and represent their views, wishes and feelings. Why not join our bank of advocates? You choose when you're available

Your volunteering can be arranged to suit your availability. Your life experience will be highly valued and you will be trained and supported in developing key skills.

December Message Rt Revd Michael Beasley, Bishop of Bath and Wells



His light is never extinguished

As 2022 comes to a close, our hearts go out to the people of Ukraine whose country was invaded by Russia on the 24 February this year. In the months since, we have watched in horror as civilians, cities and infrastructure have been attacked, land occupied and atrocities committed.

The UK has received more than 100,000 people fleeing from the conflict. The gift of their presence among us reminds us that this is no "quarrel in a far away country, between people of whom we know nothing".

As we recall once again the coming into the world of Jesus at Christmas, our challenge is to connect our celebration of his birth with the realities and consequences of the conflict that is happening. Sadly, it's not hard to see the links. Jesus was born in a land (Palestine) that had been annexed by an expansionist foreign power (Rome) in pursuit of its territorial ambitions. The demands of the Roman occupiers meant that Jesus' birth happened not at home in Nazareth, but at a counting centre - Bethlehem. He was born in a stable because 'there was no room at the inn'. While still a baby, Jesus became a refugee when taken to Egypt due to warnings of atrocities to come.

Viewed this way, the Christmas story is no sentimental fable. It is a brutal foreshadowing of the events that Ukraine and our whole world have encountered this year. At the same time, it is also a story of hope. For it tells us that even in the very worst that can happen the Christ child whose birth we celebrate knows all too well the realities of the human condition. As a result, in any darkness his light is never extinguished. For he is Emmanuel – God with us.

So, as we come to the end of 2022, we give thanks that God is always with us in whatever we face. May he be with Ukraine. May he be with Russia. And may he be welcomed by us all.

Tales of old

Throughout the 1730s, Edward Willes rose through the ranks of the clergy. In 1730, he became a prebend of Lincoln Cathedral then, courtesy of King George, its Dean. The historian Casson was disgusted, writing in 1829, "the race is not only **not**" always but very rarely "to the swift and the battle to the strong."

From the Deanery, he was raised to the See of St David's and then to Bath & Wells in 1743. Casson: "Here he sat, for the long period of 30 years, retaining the mysterious office of "Decypherer to the King". Jointly with his eldest son Edward." The duties required a very active, laborious and incessant exertion allowing little time for anything else.

Here is a clue to his character: he promoted the careers of his children. Not only his eldest but also his youngest son and then his grandson became official *Decypherer*, a job that seems to be a Willes heirloom.

His four daughters survived into adulthood and married well: one to Sir Alex Powell and three to men appointed Archdeacons of Wells. Son Henry became our Whitchurch Prebendary, Chancellor and Precentor of Wells. Son William became Prebendary of Compton Dundon, Chancellor and Archdeacon of Wells. Only son John did not enter the church, instead becoming a Royal Naval sea captain.

This nepotism seems to have done little harm to Bishop Edward Willes at his death. He was buried with due pomp in the north aisle of Westminster Abbey (having spent most of his life in London rather than Wells.) The inscription on his grave reads:

"Under this stone lyes interred the remains of Dr Edward Willes, many years a Prebendary of this Church afterwards Dean of Lincoln, Bishop of St David's and of Bath and Wells who departed this life Nov 24 1773 in the eightieth year of his age truly thankful to God for the long and prosperous life he enjoyed here, but much more for ye comfortable hope of a joyfull resurrection to everlasting life thro the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ."

The coat of arms at the top shows the arms of the Bishop of Bath and Wells "impaling a chevron between three mullets" (or stars) for Willes.

I wish you a joyous, peaceful and very happy Christmas.

Grenville's Ramblin's...



Many years ago, Molly's father acquired an unwanted Damson bush and planted it among the other trees and bushes growing in our bit of woodland. There, being left to its own devices and gradually reaching toward the sky, the bush eventually produced flowers, some of which escaping the early frost went on to produce fruit. As the fruit ripened, I saw fit to lean a wooden ladder against this, what had become a tall bush, in order to pick some of the fruit growing near the top. However, my weight on the ladder overpowered the bush causing us to fall together in a big heap on the ground. Fortunately, there were no broken bones, but the tip of my ear getting pinched between my hearing aid and the ladder must have caused a bit of damage that recently required surgery.

So it was, as I lay on the operating table in the Royal United Hospital recently, feeling the surgeon's knife on and around my ear and wondering what the outcome would be, I was reminded of my father who lost a piece of one ear during the latter end of the last war; not I hasten to add, in actual warfare, but in an accident in a haymaking field!

In those days, the great heavily laden Lancaster bombers, taking part in daylight raids on targets that only they knew where, would come roaring down off the Mendips so low that as we stood in the fields, we were able to see the men in the cockpits of those great machines.

On the day of the accident my father was helping with the haymaking in a field near the Mendip Inn. Being used to horses, he had been given the job of driving a horse drawn machine for clean raking the hay field, which he was in the course of doing, when a huge formation of bombers came roaring over the field, frightening the horse which tried to bolt. Father, used to driving horses, had the horse under control when, unfortunately, one of the shafts on the machine broke and father was thrown under it and trundled round and round by the tines. The machine, still being dragged by the panic-stricken horse, hit a large bump in the field causing it to jump off the ground, leaving father behind but tearing off part of an ear as it did so.

No 999 in those days. However, those who went to his aid were fortunately able to locate the local doctor who came and wrapped a bandage round father's head and the wounded ear, which, while never again looking very elegant, eventually, healed up of its own accord.

I, thank God, was in the hands of a surgeon of our wonderful caring NHS.

Ashwick Parish Update

The Council was saddened by the news of the passing of Chris Sully. Chris had been a valued member of the Council and had served as Chair. He was keen to protect the character of the village and showed great interest in environmental issues. We send our condolences to Sara and his family.

Parishioners have respected the double yellow lines at the junction with the A367. However, any motorist parking on the yellow lines needs to be aware that, in the future, a Traffic Warden will visit on his rounds and tickets will be issued for any infringements.

Planning - the following applications were considered:

(a) 2022/2049/FUL Change of use of land for the siting of 6 no. bell tents for holiday accommodation, 3 no. compost toilets and shower sheds and parking. Land at 363417 146983 Bath Road, Oakhill. The Council recommended approval.

2022/1983/CLE Application for a certificate of lawful existing development for deviations from planning permission ref: 034627/002 – (Conversion of building to form holiday letting accommodation), to long term tenancy. Councillors raised concerns about parking on the road.

Initial discussion on the budget took place for the next financial year 23/24 with possible approval at the December meeting.

The Council voted to donate the recently purchased wooden table and seats to the Village Hall Committee for use within the Playing Fields. The table will replace one of the picnic tables near the children's play area and is wheelchair/pushchair accessible!

A proposal for the Village Hall Committee to care for, and maintain, the Jubilee tree along with other newly planted trees within the Playing Field was tabled and agreed.

Mendip District Council is preparing a Greenspace Audit, mapping greenspaces across Mendip, with a focus on the settlements. The audit updates previous open space studies undertaken in 2008 and 2012 and consolidates and aligns with the assessment work carried out whilst preparing the Local Plan Part 1 and Local Plan Part 2. The Draft Supplementary Planning Document from Mendip District Council on Greenspaces within the Parish was discussed and a response agreeing the identified green spaces in the Parish was submitted.

Date and time of next meeting: - Wednesday 14th December 2022 in the Village Hall starting at 7.30p.m. Parishioners are welcome to attend.

The December Garden



EAST MENDIP GARDENING CLUB – JANE EVANS

December is a quiet month in the garden, but there are many things to take care of. With limited daylight hours approaching the shortest day of the year, this month's crisp wintery weather can be strikingly beautiful and bitterly cold in equal measure.

Dig over empty borders and prepare soil for next year's planting.

Group potted plants in a sheltered spot to protect them from the harshest winter weather. Some fruit trees, roses and Japanese maples are just a few of the plants that benefit from a winter prune.

Dig over empty borders and prepare your soil for next year's planting.

Start to winter-prune wisteria, cutting back whippy summer side-shoots to 2 or 3 buds.

Prune climbing roses, removing diseased or damaged growth and tying in any new shoots to their support. Prune older flowered side shoots back by two thirds of their length.

Plant deciduous, climbing honeysuckle now, but make sure to avoid any frozen or waterlogged ground.

Prune Japanese maple trees (Acer palmatum) if needed, they will bleed sap if pruning is done any later.

Leave the faded flower heads on hydrangeas until spring to provide frost protection to the swelling buds further down the stems.

If any of your rose bushes suffered from blackspot or rust during the summer, collect and remove any fallen leaves to reduce the chance of spreading the infection next year.

Keep checking over stored dahlia tubers, keeping an eye out for rot.

Check climbers and climbing shrubs are securely attached to their supports with ties.

Harvest holly with berries for Christmas garlands and wreaths. Stand the berry covered twigs in a bucket of water until you're ready to use them.

Take root cuttings of oriental poppies and grow them on in cold frames.

Take hardwood cuttings from suitable trees and shrubs.

Lift your last leeks and parsnips before the soil freezes and heel them into a trench beside a path. They'll keep for several months like this and can be brought indoors when required.

Remove yellowing leaves from your winter brassicas — they're no use to the plant and may harbour pests and diseases.

Dig a trench for next year's beans, fill with compostable kitchen waste (not cooked food) and re-cover with soil. This will rot down and dramatically improve the growing conditions.

Prune fruit trees to maintain an open, balanced structure and encourage

quality fruit production. The exception is plums, cherries and other stone fruits that should not be pruned until the summer to prevent silver leaf fungus. Use clean, sharp secateurs to avoid damaging your trees.

Construct a screen of clear polythene over wall trained peaches and nectarines to protect from wet winter weather, which spreads the peach leaf curl fungus.

Lift and divide established clumps of rhubarb to renew the plant's vigour. Sections taken from the outside of the plant are better than those from the centre.

Apply glue bands or grease bands to the trunks of fruit trees to prevent wingless female winter moths climbing the trunks and laying their eggs in the branches.

If you haven't already done so, clean out the greenhouse thoroughly. Wash the glass, the floor and the staging with horticultural disinfectant to kill any overwintering pests and diseases. Wash and disinfect capillary matting before storing.

Work in manure to greenhouse borders to prepare them for next spring. Leave enough space to add compost later on. Wash down your garden tools and give them a wipe of linseed oil on the wooden and metal areas to help prevent rusting.

Clear out the garden shed in preparation for the spring and check the security. This is particularly important in winter when you visit it less often.

Plant bare root edible hedging while the plant is dormant.

There's still time to clean out water butts before they fill with fresh rainwater.

Wash and disinfect bird feeders and bird tables. Clean out bird baths. Hang fat balls and keep bird feeders topped up with wild bird food; they will then eat pests in your garden!

Pile old logs in an undisturbed corner to provide shelter for toads and other wildlife.

Sow hardy broad bean 'Aquadulce Claudia', or the dwarf variety 'The Sutton', outdoors under cloches.

Plant raspberry canes while they're dormant.

Plant blueberries for an attractive addition to the fruit garden. With pretty white flowers, berries and fiery autumn foliage, these acid loving plants provide constant interest. If your soil is too alkali, try growing your blueberries in containers with ericaceous compost.

Did you know the colourful wrappers of Quality Street sweets are compostable? They're made from cellulose, derived from wood pulp, so rather than chuck them in the bin, add them to your compost heap!

Take an inventory of tools and equipment that you need for next year. Add them to your Christmas list!

WEATHER REPORT: OCTOBER 2022

October was very mild with temperatures above average. Highest reading 19.3°C on the 29th. October rainfall was the highest recorded here this year with 143.1mm.

This is above average for this site.

AVIAN INFLUENZA (Bird Flu)

On 17 October 2022 an Avian Influenza Prevention Zone was declared by the Government across the whole of England. This was because of the increased number of cases of the disease across the country. All bird keepers (whether they have pet birds, commercial flocks or just a few birds in a backyard) are now required by law to take a range of precautions to protect their flocks. (Jeyes fluid is a Defra approved disinfectant for Avian Influenza).

There are minimum requirements for all bird keepers to follow. If your birds are not housed, they must be kept in fenced/enclosed outdoor areas. Precautions include (amongst others): feeding birds under cover where wild birds cannot access, preventing access by captive birds to ponds and watercourses, and effectively cleansing and disinfecting any hardstanding surfaces in areas where birds are kept. Further enhanced measures apply for premises with over 500 poultry or other captive birds.

Full details of what is required can be found on the government website - www.gov.uk/guidance/avian-influenza-bird-flu#AIPZ

You can find a self-assessment checklist at the above link to help you put the measures in place, as well as more information about the virus. You can keep up to date by regularly visiting the avian influenza section on the government website, and by registering for email or text alerts -

www.gov.uk/guidance/apha-alert-subscription-service

Remember that if you have poultry/captive birds it is your responsibility to keep updated on any outbreaks and an easy way to do this is by signing up for text notifications - register with the APHA alerts service. If you have any concerns about the health of your birds, you should promptly speak to your vet.

The risk to public health from the virus is very low, however it is important that people don't pick up sick or dead birds. You can report finding dead wild waterfowl (swans, geese or ducks) or other dead wild birds, such as birds of prey, to the DEFRA helpline on 03459 335577.
