

Open Yourself Afresh

Letter from Michael Beasley, Bishop of Bath and Wells

Did you ever wonder where the term 'Lent' comes from? The word is a gift from our Anglo-Saxon past. It means 'lengthen', a naming of the longed-for reality of this time of year when we become aware that, at last, the short days of winter are coming to an end, the nights are drawing out and the days are getting longer, they're lengthening. As well as naming what we're seeing, Lent has its meaning within the life of the Church. Its season of 40 days is a time of preparation for the coming of Easter, our annual celebration of Jesus rising from the dead. It reflects the 40 days that Jesus was tempted in the wilderness after his baptism. So, for much of Christian history it's been a time of prayer and fasting – the origin of our 'giving something up for Lent'.

Lent developed from the practice of the early Church. Back then, as still happens today, converts entered into the faith through baptism. The main time that baptism took place was Easter Eve, the night before Easter Sunday. Lent marked the final, intensive 40 days of preparation experienced by those to be baptised (known as catechumens) in readiness for their embarking fully on their new life with Christ.

The time to get ready for Lent is now. This year its first day, Ash Wednesday, falls on the 5 March. There's so much we can do to bring this season home into our hearts. Why not join your church's Lent Group? Read one of the Lent books available at this time of year? Take something up? Commit to a regular time of prayer? Find out about getting confirmed? Lent is a rich gift to us to go deeper into our Christian life. As the days lengthen and the light comes, I encourage you to use this time to open yourself afresh to the one who comes to us afresh with new life at Easter – the risen Lord, Jesus Christ himself.



OAKHILL BREWERY

Sale of Property


Do you live in any of the houses mentioned in the chart opposite?

The Oakhill Brewery is often said to have owned most of Oakhill. 'Most' may be a slight exaggeration, but they certainly owned a substantial amount of the village: from shortly after its beginning in 1767 the Brewery either built or bought the properties needed to house its workforce, so their workers were also their tenants. But they were good landlords, providing secure employment, free water, gas, and parties and coal at Christmas, among other things.

Then in 1925 the Brewery succumbed to a catastrophic fire, after which the village was never the same. The company was taken over by Bristol United Breweries (BUBs) and while malting remained in Oakhill brewing moved to Bristol, later into Shepton Mallet. The houses, though, continued in the ownership of the original Oakhill Brewery Company, itself under the prevailing firm. In 1956 Georges Brewery took over BUBs. Georges then sold off a small number of the Brewery's properties. Then in 1961 Courage took over Georges. Gradually, most of the remaining properties were sold off by Courage.

To take one of these as an example, No 5 Elm Tree Cottages was sold by the Oakhill Brewery Company on 6th November 1961, to Mr Harold Henry Tucker and Mrs Dorothy May Tucker, for £500. One of the two Directors who signed the deed was Hugh Cam Hobhouse (1917-86), then living at Ashwick Court. He remained a Director of the company until his retirement in 1975, when he moved away from Ashwick.

Another sale, not part of the Brewery's divestment of domestic property, was for part of the Oakhill Inn. In 1962 ownership of the Oakhill Inn had been transferred by the Oakhill Brewery Company to Courage. In 1975 Somerset County Council wanted to widen the road at the junction by the Inn, so bought two sections of the Inn's land from Courage, for £11,000. It measured 134 square metres and resulted in the loss of the Skittles Alley.

PLANNING

2025/0326/FUL Proposed demolition of existing dwelling and erect new 4-bedroom dwelling and associated works. Beacon Cross Farm, Old Frome Road, Maesbury. *Recommendation*: The Parish Council recommended approval.

2025/0306/OUT Application for outline planning permission with all matters reserved for development of six detached houses and a pair of semi-detached houses and garages. Land at 363907 147136 Fosse Road, Oakhill. *Recommendation*: The Parish Council recommended refusal.

2024/1807/FUL The removal of existing wind turbine and erection of replacement of wind turbine, up to 74m blade tip, with associated development. Land west of Warren Farm, Old Frome Road, Maesbury. *Recommendation*: Ashwick Parish Council recommended approval.

SPEED INDICATOR DEVICE

The recently published Community Review had highlighted concerns about traffic speeds in the village specifically along the A367, past the school. This is a topic much discussed over the years; in the past the council has supported SIDs shared between parishes, This scheme is no longer active. The Councillors agreed to submit possible locations to Somerset Council for approval with a view to purchasing its own devices.

DOG BIN

The Council RESOLVED to donate a dog waste bin to the Village Hall Committee, to replace the damaged and rusting dog bin sited at the entrance to the Recreation Ground.

COUNCIL MEMBERSHIP

The Council co-opted and welcomed Stephanie Dowley, Head Teacher of Oakhill Church School and Nursery, onto the Parish Council. Membership is now 9!



PEACH BLOSSOM THYATIRA BATIS

This lovely little moth is found throughout Europe. It is a striking species with brown forewings marked with five pink and white blotches which do rather resemble the petals of peach blossom. It flies at night in June and July and sometimes a second brood emerges in late August and September.



Its Latin name, Thyatira, is the name of a city which in classical times lay in the far west of Turkey, about 50 miles from the Mediterranean, now called Akhisar. It was and still is famous for it's dyeing of cloth, particularly of royal purple colour. There is a story in the bible of Lydia of Thyatira, who was a cloth merchant for purple dyed fabric; she was converted to Christianity by the apostle Paul on his visit to that area. Thyatira in early Christian times was home to a significant Christian Church, mentioned as one of the seven Churches of the Book of Revelation. Maybe Linnaeus, who named this moth, thought the blotches of colour on the wings were reminiscent of tie-dyeing patterns in ancient times!

In 1922 the Patriarch of Constantinople appointed an Exarch for Western and Central Europe with the title Archbishop of Thyateira, who resides in London and has pastoral responsibility for the Greek Orthodox Church in the United Kingdom. The other half of its Latin name – Batis, Greek batos = prickly shrub, for example the Bramble which is the foodplant of the caterpillar.



SURF AND TURF ON TOAST

Ingredients


- 4 slices of sourdough bread (Queen Street Deli's seeded is particularly lovely!)
- 10 king prawns
- 2 small (150-200g)
 portions of venison loin
 (sometimes called backstrap)
- Cornichons or gherkins
- Mustard
- · Mayonnaise
- Lemon
- Sesame oil
- 2 cloves garlic
- 2 red chillis
- Small piece of root ginger

Directions

- 1 Either the night or a few hours ahead of time marinade the meat and prawns. I marinaded the prawns in lemon zest, sliced red chillis, a good pinch of salt, some chopped ginger, sliced garlic and a drizzle of good olive oil. For the venison (or a nice bit of rump, sirloin or rib-eye steak) marinade in sesame oil, soy, ginger, chilli and some Chinese five spice. Place these in the fridge overnight or for a few hours, removing a good hour before cooking.
- 2 Make the sauce for the prawns by dicing cornichons or gherkins and mixing with a teaspoon of mustard, 2 tablespoons of mayonnaise, the juice of half a lemon and salt and pepper. Taste to check and set aside.
- Remove the meat from the marinade, allow the bits of chilli, ginger etc to come off before cooking in a hot pan, 2/3 minutes per side then place on a warm plate to rest. Butter both sides of 2 slices of bread and toast in the same pan you cooked the meat in. Remove the toast and add a splash of wine, a red wine or beef stock pot and a little of the marinading juices to the pan scraping the bottom of the pan, add a splash of water and allow to reduce to a thick sauce. Finish with a teaspoon of mustard (Dijon, English or wholegrain depending on preference) and a small cube of butter.
- 4 While the sauce is reducing cook the prawns in a separate pan in the same way but with only a minute or so per side as soon as they turn pink, turn them. Remove and toast the remaining two slices of buttered bread in the same pan.
- 5 Assemble by placing the prawns on their toast with the quick tartare over and then slice the meat and place on their toast with the reduced meat sauce.





CROOK PEAK, WAVERING DOWN






Start: Webbington Road, Cross

Length: 5.4 miles Time: 2hr 45mins

- 1. Free roadside parking on Webbington Road, west of A38. Turn L down Old Coach Road (signposted Weare). Immediately after small bridge, turn R through gate to follow the River Axe. After a further 3 gates (ignore small footbridge), turn R onto track. Turn R onto lane to road junction; cross road and immediately turn L to join footpath to Crook Peak.
- 2.Go past National Trust sign, pass through gate and take L fork in the path, uphill and back on yourself. Continue up steep slope and, passing through vegetation, come into open space and continue, heading towards summit; alternative paths all lead to Crook Peak.
- 3. Having admired the spectacular views from the peak, reverse a few steps and continue round the summit to meet the wide grassy path heading east. Join the West Mendip Way, keeping the drystone wall on your left, across Wavering Down. Pass a stone seat with the inscription "Only a hill but all of life to me" and continue to the white trig point to see more amazing views.
- 4. Keeping the drystone wall on your left, continue down to Hill Farm and, just as the wall ends, branch R to walk along the ridge of Cross Plain. Continue in a SSE direction, remaining on the ridge, then descend steeply (keeping the gorse and vegetation on your right) to join a footpath at the base of the hill. Turn R leaving the wall on your left and come to an opening at the disused quarry.
- 5. Turn L through a small gate, down a few steps and follow path back to Webbington Road. Turn R to return to Old Coach Road and starting point.



Check your patio plants aren't drying out. Try mixing water storing granules with compost to improve water retention in containers.

Prune your penstemons now — cut back all the old shoots to the base, provided there is new growth at the bottom of the plant. If there are no new shoots at the base, cut just above the lowest set of leaves.

Lift and divide established border perennial plants now, like Hostas, to improve vigour and create new plants for your garden.

Tie in new honeysuckle and clematis stems. These plants will be putting on growth now, and you'll need to train them along their supports.

Continue to remove faded flowers from winter pansies to stop them setting seed. This will encourage flushes of new flowers throughout the spring.

Apply a layer of mulch around your perennials and biennial plants, trees and shrubs before the hot weather arrives. Use organic matter such as well-rotted manure.

Prepare vegetable seed beds by removing all weeds. Cover prepared soil with sheets of black plastic to keep it drier and warmer in preparation for planting.

Feed raspberry canes, fruit bushes and fruit trees to encourage good crops this season. Top dress containers with fresh compost. If your containers are already full, replace the top 5 cm of old compost with fresh compost.

Sow scented bedding plants, such as dianthus and osteospermum, for beds & borders full of delicious fragrance over summer.

Sow Scabious seed undercover now. Bees and butterflies love them and great for cut flowers.

Direct sow wildflower seed mixtures — they're great for bees and butterflies, and they add wonderful colour too.

Plant forced flower bulbs (such as hyacinths and daffodils) into borders, once they've finished flowering.

Plant or pot on any hardwood cuttings taken last year.

Plant climbing annuals and climbing perennials for bold splashes of colour around pergolas, fences or arches in the summer.

Sow marrow, pumpkin, squash and courgette seeds under cover. Sow cucumbers and gherkins towards the end of the month in individual pots or modules in the greenhouse.

Start kale seeds now under glass, or directly into seedbeds outdoors.

Direct sow Calendula seeds now - they are ideal for the vegetable garden, attracting insects and providing edible flowers.

Direct sow carrot and parsnip seeds in rows outdoors, making sure the soil remains moist for good germination. Sow 3 or 4 seeds every 20 cm, and then thin seedlings to leave the strongest plant.
